On Wednesday 1st December Year 10 pupils finally got to go on their much awaited visit to Kidzania in London. Covid disruptions and regulations have meant these pupils couldn't go in May as planned so have waited patiently until now.

An early start meant staff and pupils could be on the road for 8 am maximising time in the unique indoor city. Kidzania is a place where pupils are given the freedom to be whoever they want to be and explore their individual passions, talents and skills through a range of educational, exciting and immersive experiences. Replicating real life, pupils get the opportunity to earn currency in role-play professions which they can then spend on experiences, or purchase souvenirs. This is a great opportunity to demonstrate the relevance of working hard in a given career and reaping the rewards of their hard earned Kidzania pennies!

Pupils made a really positive impression on staff and because the centre was relatively quiet, pupils had plenty of opportunities to try many diverse experiences from window cleaning, to working with the Emergency service, to being a vet, to being a professional drummer!

Following their enriching experience we went to a restaurant for a well earned meal and a drink (and a rest!) before heading home.

Huge credit to the Year 10 pupils who attended and engaged fully with the day getting the most out of this careers experience. 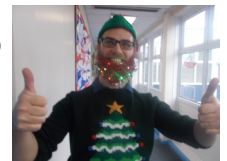
CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION
