FOOTBALL REPORT

Elmwood lined up for their second league game of the season against Millgate. Millgate are currently top of the league with a number of wins already under their belt so Elmwood pupils knew it was going to be a tough game. Upon arrival of the away team it was clear to see our younger pupils in year 7 were going to have to dig deep as the away team was full of year 11 pupils who towered above Elmwood. Nevertheless, Elmwood never shy away from a challenge and the team were ready to go to war.

As the game kicked off Elmwood settled into their groove early on and played some great football that saw us have a few quick chances by Cameron Willetts and Re'Shae Pearman but unfortunately were unable to find the back of the net. Millgate however were able to find the net shortly after with a phenomenal strike from their centre forward that was fired into the top corner. Elmwood re-grouped and kept a solid formation throughout the first half that Millgate found difficult to break down. Both teams battled it out in the middle of the park and there were few chances for either team. That was until late in to the second half where Elmwood surged forward to try and steal a goal and level the score before half time. Riley Higgs found a fantastic pass through to Malachi Grainger who shot but it was saved by the goalkeeper. Millgate seized the opportunity to go on the counter attack. With a quick pass out from the goal keeper and, a flurry of passes in their defence, they were 3 on 2 with Elmwood's defence and managed to squeeze the ball past the goalkeeper and take the score to 2-0.

A quick team talk at half time celebrating all the success of the first half and, not looking at any negatives, filled the boys with confidence as they walked back out on the pitch for the second half. Again another solid 15 minutes for Elmwood as they settled into the half and managed to stop any chances from Millgate and shut the play down in the middle of the pitch. With some fantastic additions from the new year 7's such as George Hancox, Riley Cabrera, Junior Stansbie, Charlie Smyth, Rocco Ratcliffe and Malachi Grainger, we were able to create some exquisite passages of play but just could not find the back of the net due to the physicality and strength of the opposition. As the second half closed out the opposition stayed strong and managed to find 2 goals late on as Elmwood's fitness levels held them back from competing till the final whistle.

The game finished 4-O to Millgate but once again Elmwood should hold heir heads high for a top class performance throughout the team. Everyone played their part and gained valuable experience that we aim to take into our next fixture in the new year.

Hilary Shaw, Food Technology Teacher, who helped with the serving of the meal.


