CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR YEAR 115 ON THEIR GCSE RESULTS

The cohort of Year 11s in 2022 have demonstrated great resolve and commitment during the re-introduction of examinations post COVID-19. As a school we are always striving to provide each and every cohort the best possible opportunities and outcomes, this year has been no different.

This year will see many "comparisons" between 2020 and 2021 but as a school community we will celebrate the 2022 cohort in their own right, as the wealth of positive messages we received from pupils, parents / carers and professionals following their leavers' assembly really emphasized the true purpose of our school's roles and responsibilities in developing well rounded and beautiful people who are a credit to our school's values and vision.

There were though many "firsts" yet again this year – and these were the standout moments:

- 12 /17 (71%) of pupils achieved a GCSE Maths result.
- 3/4 (75%) of pupils achieved a grade 4 or 5 in GCSE Art.
- 2 pupils achieved a Level 2 Distinction in their BTEC Sport our highest ever grade across any BTEC qualification suite.
- 5/7 (71%) of pupils achieved a Level 2 Pass in their BTEC Performing Arts our most successful cohort.
 - Maintained 100% pass rate within BTEC Home Cooking Skills (Level 1 and Level 2).



Craig's Duke of Edinburgh Award

My name is Craig Williamson and I left Elmwood a year ago but I came back to Elmwood once a week all of last year to help with Out and About and PE lessons. I did this for the volunteering part of my Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award, which I'm doing through Scouts. I had to set myself some aims at the start of the 12 months and work to achieve them through helping in the lessons then Mr. Cross wrote a report on how well I had met my goals.

This was one of 5 parts I had to do and each one is for a different length of time. I had to learn a new skill or improve my skills so I chose cooking and I learnt new recipes and tried to work on my presentation. It was for 6 months. I had to do an expedition for 4 days walking about 20 km a day and then do a group presentation on the places we visited and what we had found out. In August I did my residential trip. It is for 4 nights and has to be done without anyone else you know there whether they are an adult or a young person. There were lots of things to choose from but I chose a mountain skills course in Wales. It was fun doing lots of hiking, climbing, pitching tents and some survival skills. I got certificates for mountain skills and climbing which will be good for the future especially because I have just started doing a BTEC Level 3 Sports course at college. All I have left to do now is finish my physical skill. I'm doing hockey and need to do it for 18 months so I should finish it in March next year. Then the assessor will look at everything I have done and decide if I have passed.

I have learnt a lot from doing my Duke of Edinburgh Award. It has made me go into situations I find difficult but I know that has helped me starting a new College. At Elmwood, I gained confidence in communicating with both the pupils and the staff and understood the way to give clear instructions to help pupils learn the skills.

I would tell anyone to do a Duke of Edinburgh Award if they get the chance. It is challenging but fun and it has been good for me. And thank you to Elmwood for helping me to do it. Report by Craig Williamson, former Elmwood pupil
